SENATE TRANSITION EXCHANGE PROGRAM (STEP) DAY

Appendix 21

The Student Senate of the Associated Student Government of Santa Clara University will observe STEP Day every year, in acknowledgement that many Senators are unable to continue their projects after graduation and that the learned knowledge of their experience may not fully be carried over to successive Senators. This pilot program is further written with the understanding that many newcomers to ASG would benefit from working on an established project with achievable goals in order to better their understanding of the legislative process of student government.

1. The structure and format of STEP Day is as follows:

1.1 Nomenclature The Week Five (5) Senate meeting of the Fall Quarter shall be referred to as STEP Day.

1.2 Full Senate During the Week Five (5) Senate meeting of the Fall Quarter, first-year Senators will be sworn in as members of the Associated Student Government.

1.3 Invitation Procedure During Weeks 2 and 3 of the Fall Quarter, the incumbent Senate Chair will invite former members of ASG to attend STEP Day.

1.4 Eligibility Eligible attendees will be limited strictly to: (1) former Senators who are students but no longer members of the Associated Student Government; (2) alumni who were previously members of the Associated Student Government; (3) current members of the Student Senate who are continuing projects from a previous term served.

1.5 Presentations Presenters of projects will speak before the Student Senate. These presentations will detail previous projects undertaken, their procedures, and the level of completion the presenter has achieved. The method of presentation will be at the discretion of the incumbent Senate Chair.
